## Final exams of MBA, law courses from Dec last week

**Indore:** Devi Ahilya Vishwavidyalaya (DAVV) plans to conduct examination of MBA elite programmes including Finance Management, Marketing, Foreign Trade, part time courses and last semester law courses from December last week.

The examination will be conducted for the first and third semester students of MBA, fifth semester of law courses, ninth semester course of BA LLB in December. DAVV's exam controller Dr Ashesh Tiwari told TOI.

"While the examinations are scheduled to begin from December 25, the varsity has decided to conduct the examination of the law courses of the other semesters from the first week of January as it has issue of examination centre," he added.

DAVV also plans to conduct examination of law courses of BCom LLB and BBA LLB from first week of January and this is the first time that the varsity will be conducting these two examinations.

The varsity will give out the results of post graduate courses such as MCom and MA of first and third semester in the last week of December. The examination got over in November last week and the result will be given within 21 days time, said Tiwari.

There are around 12000 students of MA and over 10000 students of MCom who have been waiting for the result.

Apart from the post graduate courses, undergraduate courses such as BA, BCom, BSc of fifth semester is also over and the result is likely to be declared by first week of January.

# After A+ grade, DAVV plans to set up research chairs

**Indore:** After getting an A+ grade, Devi Ahilya Vishwavidyalaya (DAVV) will now apply to University Grants Commission (UGC) for setting up three or four research chairs at the varsity.

The Commission will set up 10 chairs in different universities in the name of eminent women academicians, artists, scientists, environmentalists and social reformers.

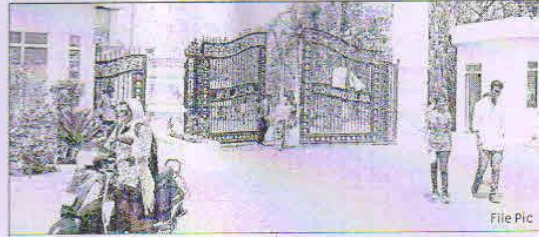
DAVV is considering chair of Lilavati (mathematics), Hansa Mehta (educational reform), Mahadevi Verma (literature) and is likely to also apply for chair of Kamala Sohoni (science) or Madurai Shanmukhavadiyu Subbulakshami (music and performing arts).

"The varsity wanted to apply for chair of Devi Ahilya Bai Holkar (administration) but as per UGC norms, a varsity cannot apply for a chair which is in name of a dignitary from its own state," media spokesperson of DAVV, Dr Chandan Gupta told TOI. "This project will be funded by ministry of women and child development," he said.

UGC has asked universities to send detailed proposals that would also include annual budget for the chair within a span of 21 days.

DAVV will soon conduct a meeting of all heads of University Teaching Departments to finalize number of chairs. The chair will be 100% funded for five years extendable for further five years as per the UGC norms.

### UGC HAS NAMED CHAIRS AFTER:

> **Lilavati (Mathematics)** | She was daughter of a prominent 12 century mathematician Bhaskaracharya, also known as Bhaskara II

> **Hansa Mehta (Educational Reforms)** | She was a reformist, social activist, educator and writer

> **Mahadevi Verma (Literature)** | She was a Hindi poet, freedom fighter and educationist

> **Kamala Sohoni (Science)** | A pioneering biochemist, she was first Indian woman to receive PhD in a science discipline

> **Madurai Shanmukhavadiyu Subbulakshami (Music & Performing Arts)** | She was Carnatic singer from Madurai and first musician ever to be awarded Bharat Ratna

> **Lal Ded (Poetry and Mysticism)** | She was creator of a style of mystic poetry called Vatsun or Vakhs (speech)

> **Amrita Devi (Beniwal) (Forest/Wildlife Conservation)** | She sacrificed her life along with her three daughters -- Asu, Ratni and Bhagu in the year 1730 to save trees from being felled by Maharaja of Jodhpur at Khejarli in Marwar, Rajasthan

> **Devi Ahilya Bai Holkar (Administration)** | She was Holkar Queen of Maratha Malwa kingdom

> **Rani Gaidinliua Naga (Freedom Fighter, North-East)** | She was spiritual and political leader who led a revolt against British rule in India

> **Anandibai Gopalrao Joshi (Medicine and Health)** | She was first Indian female physician
