Martyrs' kids may get free edu at pvt colleges

Indore: Children of the martyrs may not have to pay fee even at private colleges of Indore. Devi Ahilya Vishwavidyalaya (DAVV) will soon call a meeting to urge all private colleges affiliated to the varsity to exempt the fee for them, the executive council decided on Monday.

"While the children of the martyred will be exempted from the fee at all the university teaching departments (UTD), EC member Alok Dawar gave suggestion to get this policy included even in the private colleges," said DAVV vice-chancellor N K Dhakad. The varsity will call all

principals of affiliated colleges and request them to comply with it, he added.

EC meeting was conducted after three months. EC members also decided that three-member exam committee of the varsity will probe the malpractices in BEd second-semester case

from now. The exam committee of the varsity includes head of the department of School of Education Dr Kamakshi Agnihotri, Archana Dubey, and Renu Jha who will be probing the issue.

"Even after two months

of BEd result debacle, we are back to square zero as the head of the committee, additional director of DHE Dr K N Chaturvedi had backed off after a month. As such issues put a question mark on credibility of the varsity, we have decided to let exam committee probe the issue," executive council member Alok Dawar told TOI.

The decision on the transfer of back batch of MBBS and BDS examination will be taken by the registrar as the decision to transfer them to Jabalpur University was neither taken by the coordination committee nor was kept forth the executive council meeting, he added.

Registration for CET gets extension till June 15

Indore: Students can now register themselves for Common Entrance Test (CET) type I examination till June 15 with Devi Ahilya Vishwavidyalaya (DAVV) extending the deadline as four new undergraduate courses have been added in Group A2 of CET type I. The new courses are BSc (electronics), BSc (hons) physics, BSc (hons) mathematics, BSc (hons) applied statistics and analytics.

"Some of the new courses that have been cleared by executive council to be rolled

out from this academic session have been added in CET type I examination. As there are 13 days remaining to conduct CET type I examination, we have extended last date of registration," media spokesperson of DAVV, Dr Chandan Gupta told TOI.

The application fee is Rs 1500 and student, who has applied in group A2, will not have to apply again, he added. Currently over 19000 students have applied for various DAVV courses out of which over 16000 applicants have registered themselves for various undergraduate and post graduate courses for CET type I. Online registrations for other courses have also been extended till June 15. Students, who have already applied in Group H/I/J/K will not have to apply again, they will be able to update their choices of programmes. The application fee is Rs 750," said Gupta. TNN
